
- Seek gualified assistance immediately if (!) there is a noticeable drop in the fluid level.
- If fluid loss is slow, the reservoir may $\textcircled{\label{eq:states}}$ be topped-up to the upper level mark to enable the vehicle to be driven to a repair facility for examination. However, it is recommended that you seek qualified assistance before driving the vehicle.
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Do not attempt to drive the vehicle to a repair facility, if there is a danger that leaking fluid will come into contact with a hot surface, such as the exhaust.

Check and top-up the fluid level with the engine switched off and the system cold. See 221, FLUID FILLER LOCATIONS.



The fluid level should be maintained between the MIN and MAX marks.

TOPPING UP THE DYNAMIC RESPONSE FLUID

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Dynamic response fluid will damage painted surfaces. Soak up any spillage with an absorbent cloth immediately and wash the area with a mixture of car shampoo and water.



Do not fill the reservoir above the MAX mark.

- 1. Clean the filler cap before removing to prevent dirt from entering the reservoir.
- 2. Remove the filler cap.
- **3.** Using the approved fluid, top up the reservoir until the fluid level is between the MIN and MAX marks. See 270, LUBRICANTS AND FLUIDS.
- **4.** Replace the filler cap.
