SURROUND CAMERA SYSTEM

It remains the driver's responsibility to detect obstacles and estimate the vehicle's distance from them when manoeuvring the vehicle.



To switch on the Surround camera system, press the button on the Touch screen surround. Alternatively, select **Extra features** on the **Home menu**, then **Cameras**. See **84**, **TOUCH SCREEN HOME MENU**.



- Enlarge: To enlarge a camera view, touch the image, then touch the Enlarge soft key. Any two images can be selected and enlarged, to view side-by-side, on the screen. When viewing two images, one of them can be selected to view as a full screen image. It can be zoomed into and panned around using the magnifier and arrow icons.
- 2. Proximity View: Touch to display a combination of two images from the front and passenger side cameras.
- **3. Special Views**: Touch to display a selection of preset views. They are provided to assist with difficult manoeuvres and are:
 - Kerb View: Shows views in close proximity to each side of the vehicle.

- **T Junction View**: Shows views to the left and right from the front camera.
- **Trailer View**: Shows the default trailer view for the connected trailer.
- **Birds-eye View**: Shows a 360° plan view from above, using all four cameras.
- **Rear Junction**: Shows a very wideangle view from the Rear camera.
- 4. Tow Assist: Touch to display the trailer guidance setup screen.

The four cameras that are used for the Surround camera system are located in the centre of the front grille, above the rear licence plate, and underneath each of the exterior door mirrors.

Note: The quality of the camera views may vary in different lighting conditions.
